TeleHealth Nursing Scholarship

In 2018, the North Carolina Foundation for Nursing and TeleHealth Services partnered to create the TeleHealth Services Nursing Scholarship. The TeleHealth Nursing Scholarship was established as a scholarship program to support registered nurses who are pursuing a BSN in North Carolina.

Purpose: Scholarships are available to registered nurses who have chosen a career in nursing and are pursuing a BSN at an accredited North Carolina nursing program.

Requirements (*Applicants must meet the following criteria*)

1. Must be a resident of North Carolina for at least 12 months prior to application.
2. Must be a current nursing student or have been admitted to a nursing program at an accredited program in North Carolina offering a **baccalaureate** degree in nursing.
3. May be enrolled part-time or full-time, at least 6 hours per semester.
4. Must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.5 in work already completed in the program in which currently enrolled or in previous nursing program, if no course work has been taken in the current program.
5. Must have a proven financial need.

Amount of Scholarship: Up to \$2,000 per year.

Scholarship Information

The Telehealth Services Nursing Scholarships are awarded without regard to race, sex, religion, age or national origin. Priority will be given to NCNA members. The applicant is responsible for assembling the materials together in one packet and submitting it to the NC Foundation for Nursing by 4:00 PM on May 31, 2019.

Incomplete applications or those received after 4:00 PM on May 31, 2019 will not be considered for the Scholarship Funding.

Application Process

Provide the Scholarship Committee the following information in a single envelope or pdf document:

1. Completed Scholarship Application
2. Applicant Statement
3. Two Letters of Reference
4. A copy of unofficial transcripts from last two years of coursework. *If applicant has not been enrolled in an academic institution in the last five years, a letter from a supervisor verifying applicant's responsibility, adaptability, motivation, and capacity for success will be accepted in place of transcripts.
5. A copy of the most recent Student Aid Report (SAR) taken from the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) application. *If a student does not have a FAFSA report, a detailed explanation of why and a list of other grants, scholarships and loans received and the amounts will be required.
6. Proof of Acceptance to a BSN program at an accredited institution in North Carolina.

Basis of Awards

The Scholarship Committee will award the following point values in the seven categories listed below when judging applicant for scholarship awards

1. Financial Need – Maximum of 25 points

Financial need will be based on the expected family contribution (EFC) on the Student Aid Report (SAR) of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

2. Grade Point Average – Maximum of 15 points

3. Community Involvement – Maximum of 15 points

The applicant should include leadership roles in his/her school, the community and other volunteer activities supporting one's own community.

4. Letters of Reference – Maximum of 15 points

Two letters of reference from individuals knowledgeable of the applicant's character, contributions to community, and potential for contributions to nursing. Letters should address the applicant's leadership potential and meaningful contributions to professional nursing. One letter should be from a person knowledgeable about the applicant's educational ability and one from a person who can address the applicant's professional leadership potential.

5. Applicant Statement – Maximum of 30 points

The applicant statement is a summary of not more than 500 words presenting applicant's reasons for pursuing an education in nursing and demonstrates qualifications for the award. This statement should include how professional experience, professional and educational goals, and ambition would contribute to nursing practice. Applicant also needs to describe how they are engaged in patient and/or staff education in their organization.
